

# INTRODUCTION

John NANNEY (NANNY) appears in the early land records of Virginia. On 23 January 1759, John Nanny of Sussex County, Virginia deeded to his son Thomas Nanny of Brunswick 300 acres. The land was a part of a grant made to John in 1750. (See copy of deed, page v.) One had to be twenty-one years of age in Colonial times to own land, that was the law. Assuming that Thomas had only turned twenty-one a short time before receiving the land from his father in January 1759, then the birth year for Thomas was about 1738. Thomas was the first son and the first child, based on the deed and John's will made in Brunswick County, Virginia in 1786. It may be assumed that John married a year or so before the birth of Thomas, probably about 1737. Parental consent was required for marriage before age twenty-one. We have no proof as to the date of birth of John but it was probably between 1716-19 assuming he was around twenty-one when he married.

Not only do we not know <u>when</u> John Nanney was born but <u>where</u> he was born or who his parents were. We do know that he died in 1786 in Brunswick County, Virginia. (See copy of will, page vi.)

It's possible he was born in England and immigrated to America. If John was born in the Colonies, then it is likely that he had brothers and sisters born here also, but to my knowledge none have been documented. A William and a Rice Nanny were listed in the Muhlenburg County, Virginia census for 1790, but have not been identified. These may have been kin of John. I have corresponded with a number of contempories working on Nanney genealogy; there seems to be no known connection between some of the lines. So, it is safe to conclude, 1) that John quite likely had brothers, nephews and cousins in the Colonies and 2) that there were other Nanney lines in the Colonies, maybe unrelated to John Nanney. Furthermore, it can be concluded with certainty that all the descendants of John Nanney have not been identified and therefore are not in this compilation.

Many of the Nanneys believe the family is descended from a royal Welch line but as yet there is no firm documented evidence to support this. Because there is no documentation that can tie the family back beyond John, the decision was made to include only those names that connect by pedigree to John Nanney of Brunswick County, Virginia. John Nanney is our earliest ancestor that can be reliably documented. There are some that claim linage preceding John but I have seen no documented proof.

Information on the individuals in this compilation came from many sources. Some of the sources were family members, without whose help there would be a lot fewer names listed. It would have been an almost impossible task for one person to do all the research necessary for this compilation. I thank them for sharing their information. I have tried to document the source of the information for each individual; it may seem repetitious if the source is the same for many members of a family.

I apologize for any errors, duplications and/or omissions that one may find. "To err is human!" In many cases dates have been approximated. This was done to try to get the person or family in approximately the right time period to make the pieces of the puzzle fit, logically. (See the beginning paragraph, for example.)

Some may say that since their name is spelled different from "Nanney", that they must not be related or in a different line. The name was found spelled several different ways in various documents; Nanny, Nanney, Nannie, Nany to name a few. I chose to use "Nanney" because this seems the most used spelling by the family and one spelling can be used if the data is to be tied together by computer. The computer cannot manipulate the data properly if

two or more spellings of the same family surname is used in the same data base.

As previously stated, this is not all the descendants of John Nanney of Brunswick County, Virginia. There is little to no documentation for many of the people named. Much of the information came from family records or perhaps memory, the latter not always being a reliable source. Maybe this will be the point of departure for those who want more proof of linage, or for those who unfortunately were omitted simply because of lack of information, to research and document their particular line.

Now having said all this, I would welcome any comments and corrections plus additions of any descendants of John Nanney that were omitted. It goes without saying that I would welcome any documentation or proof on any ancestor of John Nanney. Who knows! If there are enough additions to the data maybe there could be another compilation in a few years or a supplemental to this compilation.



### EXCURSUS I

### Nannau

The family of Nanneys originated near Dolgellau,

Merionithshire, Wales. "Surnames were not generally

adopted in Wales until Tudor times, when an English

High Court Judge is said to have insisted on their use,

since he was confused by the 'long series of aps'.

Some of the Welsh families assumed an existing nickname,

such as Gwyn or Wyn, meaning 'white'. Others shortened

'ap Hugh' to 'Pugh' or 'ap Rhys' to 'Prys', 'Vaughan'

is derived from 'Fychan' meaning 'Younger' or 'Junior'

used to distinguish a man from his father or uncle of

the same name. Gruffyd ap Hywel ap Dafydd ap Meurig ap

Hywel Sele, the forebears of the Nanneys, simply assumed

the name of his house, and styled himself 'Gruffyd Nannau'".

The first known house on the site of Nannau was built in 1100 by Cadwgan ap(son of) Bleddyn Prince of Powys, from whom the Nannau(or Nanney) and Vaughan families descend. Nannau was set high among the Merioneth mountains and was itself overlooked by the rocky mass

known as Moel Offrwym, the Hill of Sacrifice, on which can be traced the remains of two early British camps. Cadwgan ap Bleddyn, the original owner, was killed in battle near Welshpool in 1112 and Nannau was later burnt by Owain Glyndwr in 1404. No less than five houses, all called Nannau, have been built on this same site. There appears to be a gap in the history of Nannau about the year 1662. Gruffydd, great-grandson of old Huw, had been intended for the 'Order of the Royal Oak' by Charles II, but Gruffydd Nanney died in 1655, perhaps in exile. "Certainly the family of Nannau (as before in 1404) 'stood stiffly for the King!". Did Nannau, then, share the fate of Caergai, Ynysymaengwyn, and many other Royalist houses in North Wales at the hands of Cromwell's troops?"

A descendant of the Vaughan family said in 1964 that she believed that some of the male members of the Nanney family came to Virginia in 1660 as government aldes to Sir William Berkeley, Governor of Virginia.

No evidence to support this theory has been found.

The exclusive right of inheritance belonging to the eldest son made it impossible for all the male members of the Nanney family in Wales to inherit property, so that certainly some of them sought their fortunes in other lands. The Nanneys who came to America are discussed in Excursus II.

### EXCURSUS . II

## Nanneys in America

It is possible that the John Nanney, born about 1724 and discussed in the main part of this manuscript, is not the immigrant. He might have been a descendant of one of the following:

1. Robert Nanny(sic) was born in 1615 either in London, England or in Dolgellau, Merionithshire, Wales. He was probably the grandson of Hugh and Anne (Vaughn) Nanney of Dolgellau, Wales. Their son who was born about 1593 went to London to live. Robert Nanny(sic) came to Boston, Massachussetts in the ship, Increase, in 1635 at the age of 22 years. He was sent over by Robert Cordell, a goldsmith of Lombard Street, London. From Jenness' abstracts of original documents

relating to New Hampshire a list of the signers of the Dover combination in the year 1640, which combination was a part of the Hilton Patent granted in 1630, shows the name of Robert Nanny. He was a merchant, first at Dover and later in Boston. He married, before 1652, Catherine Wheelright. He had business dealings with the West Indies, Jamaica, and the Barbadoes, and made voyages to all these places. He called Richard Hutcheson of London "uncle". He died on August 27, 1663. His will mentioned his wife, his son, Samuel, his daughter, Mary, and her expected child. Samuel may have been dead by 1716 when Robert Nanny's widow died, for the administration of the estate fell to the son-in-law, Benjamen Dyer, there being no surviving heirs.

### NANNEY

The name seems to have originated in the 13th Century from the First Lord of Nannau in Merionethshire Wales. Cadwgan for some time associated in sovereignty of Powys with his elder brother Merideth degnified by Cambden as the renowned Brittain. His first wife was Gwenllian, daughter of Griffith King of North Wales. Howell Nanney, Esq. 10th in descent from Cadwgan Lord of Nannau was father of Richard Nanney ancestor of the Cenfdenddwr Nanneys.

William Nanney of Maes ancestor of John Nanney died in 1691. A William Nanney who was an attendant upon Henry Vii was an ancestor of Oliver Cromwell. Edward Nanney whose son Lewis Nanney, Esq. High Sheriff of Merioneth, 1634 married a daughter of John Hughes, Esq. A daughter of Rev. Richard Nanney, vicor of Clynog 1723 married Rev. Richard Ellis Vicar of Clynog 1765. David Ellis Esq, of Bodyshan Gwynfrynn Attoryney General of North Wales assumed the name of Nanney so as to inherit the estate Cefenddwr of his maternal Uncle Nanney. This explains the compound name Ellis-Nanney. Owen Johnes Ellis-Nanney, Esq, D. L. Gwynfryn Wales a member of parliament about the middle of the 18th Century who was a Baron married eldest daughter Mary and heiressof Hugh Jones, Esq. of Hengwrtucha of Merioneth. Sir Hugh John Ellis-Nanney, son of above born 1845 still alive in 1920, baroneted in 1898 and 1875 married the Hon. Elizabeth Octavia, youngest daughter of Robert Dillon 3rd, Lord Clonbrock County, Galway, Ireland. Mrs. Hon Elizabeth Octavia Ellis-Nanney or Lady Ellis daughter of a peer is dead. Mary Elizabeth only child of the above married a clergyman. Sir Hugh is last male of that branch of the Nanney family.

Ellis of Bodychan from who the present Sir Hugh Ellis-Nanney traces his maternal descent to Hwfaap Cynddelw Lord of Llys of Liffan in Angelsy Wales, who was steward and bore the crown of the Sovereign and enjoyed the heriditary right to put the crown on the Monarch's head after being annointed.

Griffith Nanney, Esp. was ancestor of the Nanneys of Nannau whose last male representative was Hugh, whose daughter in 1735 married Robert Vaughan. The records of London and Bost snow that Robert Nanney or Nanny was sent by Robert Cordell a goldsmith of London to the United States in 1635.

He first located in New Hampshire but afterwards located in Boston in 1652 and in 1654 married Catherine the daughter of Rev. John Wheelwright a well known preacher. He engaged in merchandise and amassed some property which a recorded will located and describes. He died in 1663 leaving two children, Samuel and Mary and one anticipated.

# THE FAMILY OF THOMAS CLINGMAN NANNEY (Dictated by him at the age of 87)

Three brothers, Shadrick, Jordan and Nicholas Nanney came to Rutherford County from Virginia around 1800.

Jordan returned to Virginia and information of his decendants are unknown.

Nicholas married a Geer, made his home in Montford's Cove. Years later he was accidently killed and his people moved to Arkansas in 1880-1890. Other information is unknown.

Shadrick Nanney made his home near Cathys Creek, this area is now known in 1976 as "Nanney Town," Union Mills, North Carolina.

Shadrick married Mary Cobb and their children were: Edmond, Randal, THOMAS, JAMES, William, and two daughters, names unknown. He had a second wife whose name was Wheeler, their children were: Samuel, John, Andrew, Jordan, Sallie, Rhoda, Morning and Polly.

THOMAS NANNEY (Son of Shadrick) married Polly Flack. Children: Geburn, Amos, Martin, William, Drury, Mira, Narcissus, ALZIRA, Lena and Grizzlee.

JAMES NANNEY (Son of Shadrick) married Sallie Hill. Children: THOMAS, Johnathan, Randal, Viney, Tinsey And Pricilla.

ALZIRA NANNEY (Daughter of Thomas Nanney) married Porter Morgan. Children: MARY ELIZABETH, Abner, William, Thomas Porter, and George.

\*THOMAS NANNEY (Son of James) married Miriam Koon. Children: Albert, William, Washington, Pinkney, THOMAS CLINGMAN, Angeline and Pricilla.

NANNEY (NANNAU) family, of Nannau, Mer.

Nannau, which is in Llanfachreth parish, Mer., stands 700 feet above the level of the sea, and has been for centuries the home of one of the most powerful families in the county. The 'sprouting root,' according to the bards, was Ynyr Hen, who flourished 1200-50; his son, Ynyr Fychan, took the credit of helping to capture the rebel Madog ap Llywelyn (q.v.) in 1295 and of handing him over to the victors; his son Meurig Fychan has a sepulchral effigy in Dolgelley church, with a lion carved on his shield, but it is open to grave doubt whether he was one of the garrison of Bere castle soon after the death of Llywelyn the Last. There is no cogent proof to connect Anian II, bishop of S. Asaph from 1268 to 1293 (q.v.) with this family, though a Peniarth manuscript does refer to him as the 'black friar of Nannau'; he had a brother also, and executor of his will, who signs as 'Adam de Nannew.' Nor is there sufficient foundation for the story of Hywel Sele's treachery towards Owain Glyn Dŵr in 1402—he was grandson to Meurig Fychan—so little indeed that Sir John E. Lloyd, the author of the standard work on the prince, never refers to Hywel at all. But certainly, the poet Llywelyn Goch ap Meurig Hen (c. 1370-1400) (q.v.), was cousin to Meurig Fychan, author of the famous elegy to Lleucu Llwyd. Gruffydd Llwyd sang the praises of two sons of Meurig Fychan (end of the 14th cent.); Guto'r Glyn likewise composed an elegy to Meurig Fychan II (period of Henry VI), and a cywydd to thank his son David for the gift of a horse; the polished Wiliam Llŷn (q.v.) adds a panegyric to Gruffydd Nannau (days of Henry VIII).

Between the days of Hywel Sele and the age of Elizabeth the Nanneys thrust their roots deep in the commote of Tal-y-bont through the buying up of lands in the townships of Brithdir and Dysfryndan, Cesnyrywen and Dolgleder, Garthgynsor, and Garthmaelan. The stock sent out many branches: a brother of Hywel Sele founded the family of Caerynwch; the Cefndeuddwr branch grew out in the middle of the 16th cent., that of Maes Pandy at the end of that century; the Dolau-gwyn relationships were made secure by a series of complicated marriages. The head of the house in the years 1580-1620 was Huw Nannau Hen, a very powerful personality, of whom the bards outdid each other in extravagant eulogies, no fewer than eleven of them bewailing his death in 1623. His career was not without some grave crises; he was on very bad terms with the Llwyn family, with the Lloyds of Rhiwaedog, with the Owens of Hengwrt, and these ill-wishers were joined by his own blood-relations of Cefndeuddwr (his great sin, it was said, was the pushing forward of his son Griffith, in 1593, as Member of

Parliament for Merioneth against John Lewis Owen of Llwyn). His enemies concentrated on the charge that Huw Nannau had cut down thousands of trees at Penrhos between Mawddach and Afon-wen, and had made a great fortune out of them; the Exchequer gave a verdict of guilty against him, levying a fine of £1,500; Nannau went to prison rather than pay; after many petitions to the supreme authorities, he was set free, but the fine was not brought down lower than £800 [but see the item added to the bibliographical note].

The story of Nannau is somewhat uneventful until the days of colonel Hugh NANNEY, Member of Parliament for Merioneth (1695-1701) and his termagant wife Catherine, one of the daughters of Cors-y-gedol (she d. in 1733). He was the last Nanney to hold the estate, for his heiress Janet m. Robert Vaughan of Hengwrt in 1719, great-grandson to the antiquary (q.v.; the antiquary himself had m. a granddaughter of Huw Nannau Hen). Their son HUGH VAUGHAN almost made a total shipwreck of his fortunes by his ill-regulated life and his utter incapacity for estate management, but through the pluck and pertinacity of his lawyer John Lloyd and the prescience of the very intelligent lady Elizabeth Baker (q.v.), who supervised the household at Nannau, things looked a little more hopeful at Vaughan's death in 1783, leaving his brother ROBERT HOWELL VAUGHAN (1723–92), created a baronet in 1791, to carry on the long litigation till 1788, when the Chancery masters delivered a final and very favourable verdict. It is true that R. H. Vaughan was made a baronet in 1791, but much more important for the fortunes of the family was his marriage in 1765 with Ann Williams, heiress of the Ystumcolwyn lands by Meifod, she in turn being grand-daughter to the Meriel Williams who had m. the squire of Meillionydd in Llŷn: the upshot of all this was that Sir Robert Howell Vaughan, and his son Sir Robert Williames Vaughan (1768–1843) were the quadruple possessors of Nannau, Hengwrt, Ystumcolwyn, and Meillionvdd. What wonder that the second Sir Robert reared a new mansion at Nannau, became a Member of Parliament for Merioneth in 1792, and was re-elected thirteen times, remaining a member till 1836? Thanks were paid to him in the form of an illustrated address, signed by 122 names, in July, 1836; money was collected in 1841 to found the 'Vaughan Scholarship' as a tribute to the length of his public service; and when he d. in 1843 Meurig Idris composed a long ode of eulogy (12 pages). His brother EDWARD VAUGHAN (d. 1807) had already succeeded by will to the Rûg estate (1780); these Rûg lands were in the possession of the Vaughans of Nannau till the death of the third Sir ROBERT VAUGHAN (1803-59), when the second son of

lord Newborough became proprietor. According to Sir Robert's will—he d. without children— Hengwrt went to his wife's sisters (she was a Lloyd of Rhagad) and Nannau to one of the sons of the first lord Mostyn, with the clear proviso that these were only interim arrangements for one life, that the two estates were eventually to come into the hands of John Vaughan (b. 1829), a member of the Dolmelynllyn branch of the Hengwrt family. This happened in 1874; and Vaughan was very soon faced with the problem of the new railway to Bala, the old problem of fishing in the river Mawddach, and the question of the proper royalties to charge upon adventurers for gold upon his lands. In politics he was a thoroughbred Conservative, and was an unsuccessful candidate against T. E. Ellis (q.v.) in the General Election of 1886. He d. on 29 June 1900 (Nannau MS. 835), not in 1898 as recorded in the Pedigrees of J. E. Griffith (200).

NANNEY, DAVID ELLIS (1759-1819), lawyer -see Appendix.

NANNEY, RICHARD (1691-1767), Evangelical cleric. He was b. in 1691, one of the Cefndeuddwr family by Trawsfynydd, a branch of the ancient house of Nannau (q.v.). He matriculated from Jesus College, Oxford, in 1710, graduated B.A. in 1714, M.A. in 1719; he was made vicar of Clynnog in 1718, and rector of Llanaelhaearn in 1725; Foster adds that he was also canon of Bangor. He was deeply endowed with a fine liberality of spirit, which is not at all surprising when one remembers that his mother was daughter to Richard Edwards of Nanhoron (q.v.), prominent as a Puritan squire in Restoration times, that his sister Catherine was m. to Dr. Knight of Caernaryon, another family with strong nonconformist contacts, and that his wife was one of the Wynns of Wern by Penmorfa, very open-minded in their politics. Nanney became one of the foremost supporters of the circulating schools of Griffith Jones (at Clynnog the school was often held in the parish church, at other times in distant houses on the borders); many of his letters occur in Welch Piety, all testifying to the value of education and some containing good suggestions regarding the lessons to be given, and some loud in their

praises of the old schoolmaster Thomas Gough (as Gough had at one time been the teacher of Robert Jones of Rhos-lan (q.v.), it is natural enough to find the latter's eloquent tribute to Nanney in Drych yr Amseroedd). He drank pretty deeply of the spirit of the Methodist Revivalthough he is not included among the Methodist clergymen like Griffiths of Nevern and Jones of Llan-gan—and accounts are given of crowds of people listening to him preach at Clynnog, many coming from adjoining parishes; and a vivid contrast is drawn between the apathy of his early years and the fruitful piety of the days of awakening. He held the lands of Elernion by Llanaelhaearn, a small estate that belonged to his wife's family; but things of this world mattered little to him; according to Robert Jones, he never knew any horse but the one he rode on. His son, also RICHARD NANNEY, was in holy orders (he d. in 1812), very different from his father in many respects, but quite as Puritan in his outlook on the sanctity of the Sabbath, as witness a sharp letter of his (21 Jan. 1799) to one of the Caernarvon attorneys. Catherine NANNEY, daughter of Richard Nanney the elder, m. Richard Ellis of Bodychen, another clergyman, and successor to his father-in-law as vicar of Clynnog; they were the parents of David Ellis Nanney (q.v.), the learned lawyer, ancestor to Sir Hugh J. Ellis Nanney of Gwynfryn by Llanystumdwy.

I John Nanney of the county of Brunswick being in <a href="low">low</a> state</a> of health but my perfect senses thanks be to God for the same, but considering the frailty and uncertainty of mans life do make appoint and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth (viz) First and above all I commend my Soul into the hands of a Almighty God that gave it me, trusting in the merits of my blessed Savior, Jesus Christ, for a full and free pardon of all my sins committed in this frail wicked life, and my body to have a decent Christian burial at the discression of my loving children and for what worldly Estate Almighty God hath bestowed upon me after all my lawful and just Debts is paid, I give and bestow as followeth.

Item I give to my son John Nanney one shilling to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my son William Nanney one shilling to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Caton one shilling to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my daughter Frances Massey one shilling to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Silvanus More one shilling to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my son Amos Nanney one shilling to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my son Uriah Nanney the plantation that I live upon containing two hundred and forty six acres one Negro wrench named Hagan and all the stock horses, cattle, sheep and hoggs and all my household goods, and all that is called my Estate after my decease to him and his bodily heirs forever. And I do constitute and appoint my son Uriah Nanney to be my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and testament AS WITNESS my hand and Seal this seventeenth Day of July one thousand seven hundred eighty six Signed Sealed and acknowledged to be his last will and testament.

#### Dear Sam:

Received your letter and the information on the Nanny/Nanney family and what a wonderful surprise. It has taken me several days to go through it and compare it to what I already have. There is a chance that we are cousins somewhere down the line, now how about that!

My maiden name was Adams, I was born in Dallas County, Missouri and grew up in Springfield, Greene County, Missouri. My great-great grandmother was Rebecca J. Nanny and I have been trying for years to find out who her parents were. She was born in 1809 in Virginia and was in Henry County, Tennessee on the 1850 census married to Phillip Adams. I have no date or place of marriage for them. Their children were Francis M. Adams born 24 Jan 1832 in Montgomery Co.,TN (per Goodspeed for Dallas Co.,Mo), Martin Van Buren Adams, my great grandfather, born 15 June 1838, Henry Co.,TN. and Jasper N. (Newton?) Adams born 1843, Henry Co.,TN., daughter Julia D. was born in Henry Co.,TN also. There is a connection between the Nanny families in Henry Co.,TN. and the Nanny family in Montgomery Co.,TN. Able Nanny was in Montgomery TN. very early and died there. I know Jordon was in Tennessee very early and both Able and Jordon had a daughter born in the time period my gg-grandmother was born so I feel sure either Jordon or Able was her father.

Phillip and Rebecca moved to Missouri and he died there in 1859, she returned to Henry Co., Tn until after the civil war and then returned to Missouri and stayed there until her death in 1889. Son Jasper did not go back to Missouri, he stayed in Tennessee and died there.

I would love to have a copy of the floppy disk you mentioned. My computer program is compatable with the LDS programs. I have gone to the library in Salt Lake many times and also used the LDS Library (a large one) in Los Angeles for many years, we used to live in Southern California and I would go to the library several times a week. I also did volunteer work at the Los Angeles Library for five years. Do you have an address for Lynn Fussell and if I contacted him do you suppose I could get a copy of his book? I would love to see what he has done. I contacted a woman in Tennessee and a man in Virginia who supposedly has a great deal of information and got no-where.

I am enclosing a copy of the first John Nanny's will, you may have a copy already but thought just in case you don't I would send it. I have some thoughts about his children; first I have the idea that Uriah was the oldest son and my reasoning for that is this, John Nanny was from Wales and in Wales the first son always inherited the fathers entire estate and John Nanny followed the Welsh tradition leaving everything to Uriah. Second, I think John Jr. was the third son, it was the custom to name the third son after the father. Thomas could have been the oldest son but he died about 1781 and thus Uriah who might have been the second son was put into place as the first son after Thomas's death. Thomas served in the army and may have died from wounds, I found the following: "Loyalist in The Southern Campaign, Vol II, Page 379, "Muster Roll of Capt. James Kerr's Company Queen's Rangers, J. Graves Simcoe, Esq., Lieut Col. Commandant, 25 June to 24 August 1780." "Private Thomas nanney, enlisted 24 Aug." "Attest: James Kerr, Captain."

I also found "Virginia Wills and Administrations 1632-1800, 975.5 - T635 - Cop.2, "Nanny, Thos 1781 Inventory Brunswick Co." Apparently Thomas died in 1780-1781.

In the book "Early Growth of Allen County," page 74, I found the following: "Abner Nanny received a land grant south of the Green River on Trammel Creek on September 4, 1807. A welshman whose grandfather had left the house of Nannau Dolgelly, Merionethshire, Wales, and come to the Isle of Wight County, Virginia in 1745, Abner had brought his father Uriah Nanny from Rutherford County, North Carolina, to settle in this new fertile land of Kentucky" On page 35 of this book it mentioned that Uriah was one of the oldest men in the county and that he was the father of Abner.

Jim and I traveled to Wales in 1984 and visited Nannau, it is a fanstatic place and I am planning a trip back to Wales. almost all my family lines go back to Wales and England, one goes to Germany. There was so much genealogy there and I was kinda new into genealogy so it was hard for me to copy everything. The Welsh people are wary of Americans, the desk lady at the hotel had a ball being rude to me and I was thinking of smacking her one but my good ole American manners told me not to and in the end she couldn't do enough for me. I sent pictures to a man in Virginia who supposedly had a lot of of information on the Nanny family, he kept my pictures and sent me very little info. I would be happy to have copies of these pictures made for you if you want them, I know that several Nanny family members have visited Nannau so you may have seen the Nanny House and the town of Dolgelly. Let me know if you want copies and I will have them made.

I very much enjoyed the pictures you sent, I have no pictures of my Rebecca J. but do have a picture of Mary Nanney who married David Crocket Beasley in Stuart County, Tennessee about 1835. I think Mary is a sister to Rebecca or perhaps a cousin. If you have any info on this Mary Nanny I would appreciate your sharing and if you want a copy of Mary's picture I would be happy to have a copy made for you. At this point I just don't know where Mary fits in. I have so many loose ends to tie up I keep hoping someone smarter than me will just drop a solution to the loose ends in my hands. By the way, I do have Mary Nanney Beasley's genealogy and a picture of one of her sons, if you are interested in the genealogy or pictures I will be happy to share what I have, the genealogy is on the Beasley family. One of the Beasley's married into another of my family lines. Sometimes I think everyone in the United States are related through these early marriages and it gets so confusing, not sure I will live long enough to sort it all out.

Sam, if you would like copies of my family group sheets I could have them xeroxed for you, I'm sure you have much more that I do but there could be some information that would be useful to you. What in particular are you interested in? Now about you Stallcup family, I seem to recall people by that name in Dallas Co., MO and James (Jim) is sure there was people by that name in Marionville, Missouri, Greene County. I had about 28 genealogy books on Greene Co., published by the genealogy group there, but donated them to the Library in Seattle. It's a public library and they have a large section on genealogy, I was through with the books and knew I would never use them again so Jim and I packed them up and took them to the library. They had very little on Missouri and were very happy to receive the books, I had a number of books on Maine that I included also. If I can't use them some library for all to use. It would have been easy to check these books for names. Have no idea when I will go into the city (Seattle) but if I get into the library I will check on the family names you mentioned, there could be some info in these books.

I am in the process of putting my genealogy into the computer, haven't had the computer to long and I'm a bit scared to start work on it. It will simplify things for me when it is in the computer and for safety reasons I would like to have it all on disk, even make a disk for each of our daughters. I'm almost drowning in paper. I work a little each day and get a little braver each time, should have

jumped on that computer bandwagon when they first came out that would have made it so much easier for me. I think the program I have is a good one and will probably serve me well.

I am enclosing some information on Oregon County Missouri Cemeteries. Some of my people went to Oregon County and I purchased the cemetery book looking for them. Since you have been to Oregon Co. to visit the old family place you may have all this information but thought I would send it just in case you don't have it.

Would love to attend the Nanney Reunion in Oklahoma but time just will not permit. Do you attend this reunion every year? Tell them there is a stray wondering around the Pacific Northwest looking for her gg-grandmother's parents and any TLC would be appreciated. My mother's family lived in Woodword, Oklahoma for a very long time, they moved there from Pampa Texas. I am so familiar with Oklahoma and have lots of distant relatives living in Texas and Oklahoma.

Again I think you for all the information and I hope to hear from you soon, I am so eager to learn more about the book that Mr. Fussell has, please help me obtain a copy, it may hold the key for me.

Sometime between 1800-1802, Jordan and Oney moved to Rutherford County, N.C. where three of their children were born. In 1820 they were in Hardin County, Tenn. and in 1830, Carroll County, Tennessee. while in Tenn., three more of their children were born. Jordan was in Graves County, Ky. by 1831 since he was mentioned in the minutes of Trace Creek Baptist Church on October 1, 1831. He settled a quarter section of land in the Panther Creek area. JOHN NANNY married (2) Lucy Jane Fulcher, born 1822 in Virginia. She was the daughter of Philip Fulcher. Several members of the Fulcher family moved to Kentucky about the time the Nanny families did. John's brother, George Alfred (Tobe) married Rachall L. Fulcher--sister to Lucy Jane.

In the Civil War, John Nanny, William A. Nanny, Albert Nanny, A.P. Job and probably other family members signed up in the 7th or 9th Kentucky Mounted Infantry late in 1861. Philip Nanny was in the Malitia--but I don't have any details. A.P. Job was captured at Vicksburg, July, 1863. Albert Nanny was captured in Tenn. and sent to prison in St. Louis, Mo. Walliam A. Nanny and William A. Fulcher put up a \$1000.00 bond to get him released. (William A Fulcher was Lucy Janess brother),
